"Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, the White Pines Civic Association is requesting years and cost of projects of water main replacements. Please see attached Bensenville letter."


After a search of Village files, the following information was found responsive to your request:

Village weighs options to improve sewer lines

Bensenville officials have plenty of options and ideas on improving the water and sewer systems in unincorporated Bensenville, but they may not have the money to finish all the projects.

Village staff on Tuesday presented options to trustees on possible new and improved services to the area.

Bob Glees, director of community development, and Paul Bourke, director of public works, presented their recommendations for how the Village Board should spend money currently in the reserve fund for unincorporated areas.

The money in the reserve fund comes from the surcharges paid by residents in unincorporated areas.

The village currently has \$227,000 in the fund, and Village President John Galls was firm in saying the money should not be supplemented with money from the village's general fund.

Galls said that if the money were to run out, the village should either eliminate some of the improvements or raise the surcharge to pay for the projects.

The proposal from the staff includes one base project along with three options for extending service and improving existing service.

The base project would extend or replace water and sanitary sewer lines in the following areas: Hawthorne Avenue from Second Court to Washington Street, Washington Street from Ridgewood Avenue to Briar Lane, and Church Road to 200 W. Washington St.

The base project would cost approximately \$138,000 and addresses areas the staff felt were in need of work.

The three options involve extending service to residents on Briar Lane.

The first option would bring the total cost to \$250,000, the amount available in the fund. It would bring new water and sewer pipes to Briar Lane from Third Avenue to Red Oak Street.

Option two exceeds the amount of money available in the fund. It would accomplish the same goal as option one, plus take the water main from Washington Street to Johnson School on Briar Lane, closing off what is now a dead-end water main. As a result, village officials said, water pressure for the school and the area would be improved.

Option two would cost \$280,000.

Option three would complete the Johnson School water-main loop, as well as bring new service to Briar Lane on a larger stretch, from Third Avenue to Washington Street. Total cost for the base project,

with option three, would be \$273,000.


Village officials talked Tuesday about ways to finance option three, which is the choice that includes all the projects the staff would like to begin.

Galls and the village trustees want to bring service to a larger area on Briar Street, as option three would do, in part because of concern for a family that has come before the board asking for help.

The Schmidt family, who live on Briar Lane between Second and Third avenues and would only have access to the water main if the village chose option three, has been trying to convince the village to let their home connect to a


