Dear FOI Officer:

Pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, (5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.) and your agency's implementing regulations, **I respectfully request access to and electronic copies of the contents described in Appendix A.** I believe these records are in the custody of the City/Village Clerk.

I plan to use the requested information for doctoral research and my research proposal has approval from the UIS Institutional Review Board (IRB). I am a Doctoral Candidate in Public Administration with the University of Illinois Springfield (UIS) completing a dissertation on local factors that influenced the adoption of video gaming ordinances by municipalities within Illinois. As a former mayor, I realize the importance of studying the state-local dynamic. The request for this information is necessary for a greater understanding of this policy issue and this request is for academic, noncommercial purposes.

As you know, FOIA requires an agency to reduce or even waive duplication fees where the disclosure of the information is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of government. I believe the principal purpose of my request is to access and disseminate information regarding the health, safety, welfare, and legal rights of the general public. **Therefore, I respectfully request a waiver of all duplication fees associated with this request.** If you deny this request for a duplication fee waiver, I believe that the response to this request will require fewer than 50 pages and therefore will not require a fee (5 ILCS 140/6). If this request exceeds 50 pages and incurs a fee, please notify me prior to response.

I believe that all the information I have requested is subject to public disclosure pursuant to FOIA. However, if you decide to withhold all or part of the information requested, please send me a detailed statement of the reasons for this denial along with references to the specific exemptions within FOIA you are claiming for each withheld document. I expect you to release all legally disclosable portions of otherwise exempt material.

Please note that, while the third part of my request in Appendix A requires the disclosure of a multitude of election documents, as a substitute for the more voluminous request, I would prefer just the simple completion of a municipal roster with the names and years of service for the elected municipal officials in your municipality as of July 1, 2012. I have attached a municipal roster form and an example from my own municipality as reference, and I hope this makes completion much easier.

Because I am making this request as an academic researcher and this information is of timely value, I would appreciate a response to my request within 5 working days as required by the Act.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RESTATING SECTION 4-3-23 OF THE
BENSENVILLE VILLAGE CODE TO PROHIBIT VIDEO GAMING
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BENSENVILLE**

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville (hereinafter the "Village") is a duly organized and existing Illinois municipality pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Act 96-34, effective July 13, 2009, and codified as Section 27 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/27, the Village is authorized by ordinance to prohibit video gaming within the corporate limits of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-3-23 G. of the Bensenville Village Code presently permits video gaming at licensed liquor establishments and truck stops and fraternal and veterans organizations having liquor licenses when conducted in accordance with the Video Gaming Act; and

WHEREAS, the President and Village Board of Trustees have determined that it is in the best interest of the Village and the welfare of its residents to exercise the Village's authority under Section 27 of the Video Gaming Act to prohibit all video gaming within the corporate limits of the Village,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, Counties of DuPage and Cook, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

SECTION TWO: Pursuant to Section 27 of the Video Gaming Act, Section 4-3-23 of the Bensenville Village Code is amended and restated in its entirety to prohibit video gaming within the corporate limits of the Village as follows:

4-3-23: GAMBLING:

- A. Playing: No person shall deal, play or engage in any device or game of chance or hazard, either as banker, dealer, player or otherwise, nor bet on any game others may be playing for the purpose of gaming.
- B. Possession of Gaming Device: No person shall bring into the Village or have in his possession in the Village, for the purpose of gaming, any table, thing or device of any kind or nature whereon or with which money or any other thing of value may be played for.
- C. Lottery: No person shall keep, maintain, direct or manage, or aid in the keeping, maintaining, directing or managing of, any lottery or thing for the drawing or disposing of money or any other property.

D. Seizing Gaming Devices: It is the duty of every member of the police force to seize any table, instrument, device or thing used for the purpose of gaming; and all such tables, instruments, devices or things shall be destroyed. No person shall obstruct or restrict any member of the police force in the performance of any act authorized by this Section.

E. Delivering Wagers: No person shall engage in the business of delivering wagers or bets.

F. Gambling Houses:

1. Maintaining Or Patronizing: It shall be unlawful to maintain or patronize any establishment maintained for a gambling house or resort anywhere in the Village.
2. Advertising: It shall be unlawful to advertise any gambling house or resort in any street, alley or other public place within the Village.

G. Pursuant to Section 27 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/27, video gaming of all kinds is prohibited within the corporate limits of the Village.

H. The aforesaid subsections A through G shall not apply in the following circumstances:

1. Agreements to compensate for loss caused by the happening of chance, including without limitation contracts of indemnity or guaranty and life or health or accident insurance;
2. Offers of prizes, award or compensation to the actual contestants in any bona fide contest for the determination of skill, speed, strength or endurance or to the owners of animals or vehicles entered in such contest;
3. Pari-mutuel betting as authorized by the law of Illinois;
4. Manufacture of gambling devices, including the acquisition of essential parts therefor, and the assembly thereof, for transportation in interstate or foreign commerce to any place outside this State when such transportation is not prohibited by any applicable Federal law; or the manufacture, distribution, or possession of video gaming terminals, as defined in the Video Gaming Act, by manufacturers, distributors, and terminal operators licensed to do so under the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 *et seq.*;
5. Lotteries when conducted by the State of Illinois in accordance with the Illinois Lottery Law, 20 ILCS 1605/1 *et seq.*;
6. Possession of an antique slot machine that is neither used nor intended to be used in the operation or promotion of any unlawful gambling activity or enterprise. An antique slot machine is one manufactured twenty five years ago or earlier;
7. Raffles when conducted in accordance with the Raffles Act, 230 ILCS 15/0.01 *et seq.*;

8. Charitable games when conducted in accordance with the Charitable Games Act, 230 ILCS 30/1 *et seq.*;
9. Pull tabs and jar games when conducted under the Illinois Pull Tabs and Jar Games Act, 230 ILCS 20/1 *et seq.*;
10. Games of skill or chance where money or other things of value can be won but no payment or purchase is required to participate.

SECTION THREE: That all ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, expressly repealed.

SECTION FOUR: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.



ORDINANCE NO. 42-2013

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3, CHAPTER 3, AND TITLE 4, CHAPTER 3, OF
THE *BENSENVILLE VILLAGE CODE* TO PROVIDE FOR VIDEO GAMING**

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville, (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") is a body politic and municipal corporation, organized and existing pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1, *et seq.*, became law on July 13, 2009, and allows certain enumerated licensed retail establishments to conduct video gambling within a municipality, unless prohibited by municipal ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Village has currently in effect an ordinance at Section 4-3-23 of the *Bensenville Village Code*, adopted pursuant to Section 27 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/27, which prohibits video gaming of all kinds within the corporate limits of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village believe that the Village's continued prohibition of video gaming will adversely affect Village businesses eligible for video gaming under the Video Gaming Act because their patrons will be drawn to similar businesses in adjacent municipalities that allow video gaming; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Gaming Board has drafted comprehensive rules governing video gaming, set forth at 11 Ill. Admn. Code 1800 and 35 Ill. Reg. 13021, to protect against any corruption, illegal activities, and undesired social implications of video gaming; and

WHEREAS, further, "licensed establishments," "licensed fraternal organization," and "licensed veterans organizations" as defined in Section 5 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/5, are the only kinds of businesses and organizations presently within the Village eligible for placement of video gaming terminals on their premises and are also holders of Village liquor licenses whom the Village is authorized and empowered to regulate under the Illinois Municipal Code and the Liquor Control Act of 1934, 235 ILCS 5/1-1-1, *et seq.*, and which the Village does regulate under ordinances adopted pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village find that they may supplement the protection that the Illinois Gaming Board rules afford the residents of the Village by incorporating certain of them, appropriate to the conduct of video gaming in the Village, into its regulations governing the licensing of liquor sales and consumption enacted pursuant to Illinois Municipal Code and the Liquor Control Act of 1934; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village have therefore determined that video gaming, as allowed under Video Gaming Act, with the appropriate regulation as afore-mentioned, should be permitted within the Village's corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village have further determined that the rules and regulations set out herein are necessary and appropriate for the proper conduct

of video gaming within the Village, and that accordingly, it is reasonable and necessary to amend the Title 3, Chapter 3, and Title 4, Chapter 3, of the *Bensenville Village Code* to provide for them as set out below,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, Counties of DuPage and Cook, Illinois, duly assembled at a regular meeting, as follows:

SECTION ONE: That the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth.

SECTION TWO: Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-23. G. of the *Bensenville Village Code* be restated and amended to read in its entirety:

Video Gaming: Video gaming of all kinds is prohibited within the corporate limits of the village, except as is conducted in accordance with the Video Gaming Act, 230 Illinois Compiled Statutes 40/1, *et seq.*, and Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-38, of this Code.

SECTION THREE: That Title 4, Chapter 3, of the *Bensenville Village Code* be amended by adding Section 4-3-38 as set forth below

Sec. 4-3-38. Video Gaming Ordinance; Prohibition Against other Gaming, Gambling and Gambling Devices.

A. Video Gaming Ordinance. This Section 4-3-38 shall constitute and shall be known and may be cited as the "Bensenville Video Gaming Ordinance," and shall be subject to and construed consistent with the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 *et seq.*; Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code; and the decisions and rulings of the Illinois Gaming Board pursuant thereto.

1. Definitions.

- a. "Establishment operator": Any person who owns or operates a "licensed establishment," "licensed fraternal establishment," "licensed veterans establishment," or "licensed truck stop establishment," as defined in the Video Gaming Act.
- b. "Licensed premises:" The premises on which any "licensed establishment," "licensed fraternal establishment," "licensed veterans establishment," or "licensed truck stop establishment," as defined in the Video Gaming Act.
- c. "Person": An individual, partnership, non- or for-profit corporation, limited liability company, or other entity.
- d. "Person with significant interest or control": Any of the following:



- 1) Each person in whose name a Village liquor license is maintained for the licensed premises;
- 2) Each person who has been determined by the Illinois Gaming Board or its Administrator as having, or in the opinion of the Administrator of the Illinois Gaming Board has, the ability to influence or control the activities of an establishment operator, or elect a majority of its board of directors, other than a bank or licensed lending institution that holds a mortgage or other lien, or any other source of funds, acquired in the ordinary course of business; or
- 3) Persons having the power to exercise significant influence or control over decisions concerning any part of an establishment operator's video gaming operation.

2. Payment of Village Video Gaming Terminal Fee Required. Payment of a Village video gaming terminal fee is required for the operation of each video gaming terminal within the municipal boundaries of the Village. No person shall operate a video gaming terminal or allow the operation of such on premises owned by and/or under the possession and control of such person without payment of the required Village video gaming terminal fee. The total fee payable shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) times the number of video gaming terminals on the premises and shall be payable in advance per annum to the Village Clerk on or before July 1st. For video gaming terminals first installed or additional terminals installed after July 1st of any year, the total amount of the fee shall be reduced by 8.331/3 percent for each calendar month or each part of a calendar month after July 1st (e.g., for three (3) video gaming terminals first installed on July 3rd of any year the total fee would be $\$75.00 \times 91.662/3$ percent, or \$68.75; for four (4) additional video terminal installed on September 16th of any year, the total fee would be $\$100.00 \times 75\%$, or \$75.00). No portion of any a Village video gaming terminal fee paid shall be refundable for any reduction in the number of video gaming terminal prior to July 1st of any year.

Every person applying to pay Village video gaming terminal fees shall possess and present to the Village Clerk for inspection a copy of a valid video gaming terminal operator's license issued by the State of Illinois for the terminal operator who owns and/or who is to place and maintain the video gaming terminals on the premises. Additionally, if the premises on which the video gaming terminals are to be located sells or serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises, such person shall also possess valid Village and State liquor licenses for such premise and shall presented his, her, or its State liquor license to the Village Clerk for inspection at the time of making payment.

3. General Duties of Establishment Operators. Each establishment operator has an ongoing duty to:

- a. Comply with all federal, State and local laws and regulations;
 - b. Conduct himself, herself, or itself at all times in a professional manner with the public and Village officials and staff; and
 - c. Conduct the establishment operator's video gaming operation in a manner that does not pose a threat to the public health, safety, morals, good order or general welfare of the residents of the Village.
4. Duty to Report. Each establishment operator and persons with significant influence and control must promptly report all of the following to the Chief of Police or designee:
 - a. Violation of this Ordinance, the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 *et seq.*; Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code; or any illegal conduct including, but not limited to, the possession, maintenance, or use of any illegal gaming device;
 - b. Any fact, event, occurrence, matter or action that may affect the conduct of video gaming or the business and financial arrangements incidental to the conduct of video gaming, or the ability to conduct any activity on the premises for which the establishment operator is required to be licensed as a condition of holding a Village video gaming terminal fee, including, but not limited to, any change in persons identified as having significant influence or control;
 - c. Each arrest, summons, citation of or each charge for any criminal offense or violation against the establishment operator or person with significant interest, excluding minor traffic violations; and
 - d. Any adverse action taken or nonrenewal relative to a State liquor license.
5. Duties of Establishment Operators as to Terminal Operators. If an establishment operator contracts for video gaming terminal operations on the licensed premises, the establishment operator shall have a duty to contract only with a State licensed video terminal operator who shall be in full compliance throughout the period of the Village video gaming terminal fee with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations and, specifically, the duties of such operator as set out in Section 1800.250, Subpart B of Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code.
6. Duties of Establishment Operators as to the Licensed Premises. Each establishment operator shall:
 - a. Provide secure premises for the placement, operation and play of video gaming terminals;

- b. Permit no one to tamper with or interfere with the approved operation of any video gaming terminal;
- c. Ensure that all connections with the central communications system and associated video gaming equipment are at all times maintained and prevent any person from tampering or interfering with the approved, continuing operation of the central communications system;
- d. Accept nothing of value from any video terminal operator or any agent or representative of any video terminal operator as an incentive or inducement to locate, keep or maintain video gaming terminals on the licensed premises;
- e. Upon a report that a video gaming terminal is malfunctioning, investigate such immediately, and upon determining that such is true, immediately post conspicuously on or next to the terminal a notice that the terminal is out of service and maintain such notice until the terminal is repaired or removed as required by Section 4-3-38. A. 6. f.
- f. Immediately remove all video gaming terminals from the restricted area of play:
 - 1) Upon order of the Illinois Gaming Board or its agent, or
 - 2) That have been out of service or otherwise inoperable for more than seventy-two (72) hours;
- g. Ensure that video gaming terminals are placed and remain in a designated, approved restricted area as required by the Video Gaming Act and the rules and regulations of the Illinois Gaming Board;
- h. Prevent access to the video gaming terminal area or playing of video gaming terminals by persons who are under the age of twenty-one (21) years or who are visibly intoxicated;
- i. Commit no violations of the laws of this State or Village ordinances concerning the sale, dispensing or consumption on premises of alcoholic beverages that results in suspension or revocation of any liquor license held by or associated with a licensed premises;
- j. Maintain at all times an approved method of payout for valid receipt tickets and pay all valid receipt tickets;

- k. Extend no form of deferred payment for video gaming terminal play in which an individual receives something of value now and agrees to repay the lender in the future for the purpose of wagering at a video gaming terminal;
 - l. Promptly report all malfunctions of video gaming terminals and all out-of-service terminals to the video terminal operator and promptly notify the Illinois Gaming Board of a terminal operator's failure to provide service and repair of terminals and associated equipment within twenty-four (24) hours after notice to the terminal operator;
 - m. Install, post and display and maintain signs and notices as required by the Illinois Gaming Board and by this Section 4-3-38. A;
 - n. Promptly notify the Illinois Gaming Board and the Village Department of Police of any unauthorized or illegal video gaming terminals; any video gaming device that is in violation of Section 35 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/35; or any illegal gambling.
 - o. Exercise control over the licensed premises and, in particular, maintain visibility of the entry into the video terminal area at all times by one employee who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age as required by the Video Gaming Act;
 - p. Allow maintenance and/or service of video gaming terminals and associated video gaming equipment only by licensed technicians and licensed terminal handlers possessing valid identification issued by the Board.
- 7. **Grounds for Disciplinary Actions.** A establishment operator shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Village for:
 - a. Failing to comply with or make provision for compliance with the Video Gaming Act; Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code," this Section 4-3-38. A.; any Federal, State or local law or regulation, or a control system or protocol mandated by the Illinois Gaming Board;
 - b. Failing to comply with any order or ruling of the Illinois Gaming Board or its agents pertaining to the regulation of video gaming in Illinois;
 - c. Revocation or suspension of its State video gaming license, or failure to have a current State video gaming license;
 - d. Revocation or suspension of its State or Village liquor license, or failure to have a valid State or Village liquor license, if the licensed premises sells or serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises.

- e. Misrepresentation of any information required to be provided to the Village, the Illinois Gaming Board or the State or State agency;
- f. Violation of the Video Gaming Act; Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code; this Section 4-3-38. A.; any federal, State or local law or regulation; or a control system or protocol mandated by the Illinois Gaming Board by any person identified as a person with significant influence or control;
- g. Except as shall be permitted this Section 4-3-38. A., State, or federal law, gambling or the operation of any gambling device by the establishment operator or any employee or agent thereof on the licensed premises or by any persons thereon with permission or knowledge of the establishment operator or any employee or agent of the establishment operator.

8. Proceedings on Disciplinary Actions; Sanctions. The Village may bring disciplinary actions against any establishment operator for violations of this Section 4-3-38. A in any manner authorized by law. Administrative adjudication proceedings shall be governed by and in accordance with Section 4-3-37, Administrative Adjudication, of this Code. The Village shall have available to it all sanctions and remedies authorized by law against an establishment operator determined to be in violation of this Section 4-3-38. A, including confiscation of video gaming terminals and/or terminal income, and/or fines. Fines shall not exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) per violation. Each day that any condition giving rise to a violation of this Section 4-3-38. A shall continue shall constitute a separate violation. Additionally, in accordance with 11 Ill. Admn. Code 1800.1110, the Village shall notify the Illinois Gaming Board of charges and sanctions by the Village against a video gaming establishment operator relating to the operation or use of a video gaming terminal.

B. Other Gaming, Gambling, Gambling Devices Prohibited. Video gaming at licensed establishments is expressly permitted in the Village only as authorized by and as conducted in accordance with the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1 *et seq.*; Part 1800, "Video Gaming," of Title 11, Subtitle D, Chapter 1, of the Illinois Administrative Code; and the decisions and ruling of the Illinois Gaming Board pursuant thereto, and Section 4-3-38. A of this Article III. Nothing in this Article III shall be construed to authorize, license or permit any gambling device, or gaming or gambling in any way contrary to such statute, regulations, and ordinances, or to any present or future law of the state of Illinois.

SECTION FOUR: That Title 3, Chapter 3, of the *Bensenville Village Code* be amended by adding to Section 3-3-5 thereof the following:

CLASS VG. A supplementary license authorizing the installation and operation of video gaming terminals, as provided in Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-38. A. of this Code, in

any premises issued a class A, C, E-1 or E-2 and that are a "licensed premise" as defined Section 4-3-38. A. 1. b. thereof. The premises shall comply with the requirements in Section 58 of the Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/58 and Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-38 A. of this Code for the installation of video gaming terminals thereon, and the Chief of Police or designee shall have the discretion to inspect and report upon the premises as to compliance prior to the issuance of a class VG license. A class VG license shall be issued for premises eligible for such upon proof of payment of the required video gaming terminal fees provided in Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-38. A. 2. of this Code, without any other charge therefor. The license certificate shall state on its face the number of video gaming terminals authorized for the premises. If the number of authorized video terminals is increased during the term of the license, the Village Clerk shall issue an amended certificate without charge.

SECTION FIVE: That Title 3, Chapter 3, Section 3-3-15. C. of the *Bensenville Village Code* be restated and amended to read as follows:

Automatic Amusement Devices: Unless a class VG license has been issued for the premises under Section 3-3-5 of this Chapter, no license shall be issued for the sale of alcoholic liquor at any premises where more than three (3) automatic amusement devices are installed, operated or maintained, and no such automatic amusement device shall be capable of being manipulated in such a manner so constitute a "gambling device" as defined in 720 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/28, *et seq.*, including, but not limited to, a video poker machine and slot machine.

If a class VG license has been issued for the premises under Section 3-3-5 of this Chapter, the premises or the video gaming terminal area shall at all times be in compliance with Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 4-3-38. A. 6. of this Code, and any violation thereof shall in addition constitute a violation of this Section 3-3-5. No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years, visibly intoxicated person, or any person known by the licensee or any officer, associate, member, representative, agent or employee of such licensee to be under legal disability or in need of mental treatment shall be allowed to play a video gaming terminal or be within the video gaming terminal area.

All licensees who fail to comply with the requirements of this section shall be subject to having all licenses issued to them pursuant to this Chapter suspended or revoked.

SECTION SIX: That all other ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, expressly repealed.

SECTION SEVEN: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BENSENVILLE, DUPAGE AND COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS AMENDING SECTION 4-3-38 OF CHAPTER THREE OF TITLE FOUR OF THE BENSENVILLE VILLAGE CODE TO INCREASE THE VIDEO GAMING TERMINAL FEE

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the Village is a non-home rule municipality and is limited to the amount it can charge for video gaming terminals; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois Passed HB3136 on October 28, 2021.

WHEREAS, HB3136 permits the raise of video gaming terminal fees from \$25.00 per machine to \$250.00 per machine for non-home rule municipalities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Corporate Authorities find and determine that it is necessary and desirable to amend the Bensenville Village Code for the purpose set forth herein and that the adoption of this Ordinance is in the best interests of the Village.

Section 3. Section 4-3-38.2 ("Payment Of Video Gaming Terminal Fee Required") of Chapter 3 ("Video Gaming Provisions; Prohibition Against Other Gaming, Gambling and Gambling Devices") of Title 8 ("Public Ways and Property") of the Bensenville Village Code is

hereby amended by deleting the following stricken language and adding the underlined language to read, as follows:

4-3-38:

...

2. Payment Of Village Video Gaming Terminal Fee Required: Payment of a village video gaming terminal fee is required for the operation of each video gaming terminal within the municipal boundaries of the village. No person shall operate a video gaming terminal or allow the operation of such on premises owned by and/or under the possession and control of such person without payment of the required village video gaming terminal fee. The total fee payable shall be ~~twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)~~ two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) times the number of video gaming terminals on the premises and shall be payable in advance per annum to the village clerk on or before July 1. For video gaming terminals first installed or additional terminals installed after July 1 of any year, the total amount of the fee shall be reduced by 8.33 1/3 percent for each calendar month or each part of a calendar month after July 1 (e.g., for 3 video gaming terminals first installed on July 3 of any year the total fee would be $\$75.00 \times 91.662/3$ percent, or \$68.75; for 4 additional video terminals installed on September 16 of any year, the total fee would be $\$100.00 \times 75$ percent, or \$75.00). No portion of any village video gaming terminal fee paid shall be refundable for any reduction in the number of video gaming terminals prior to July 1 of any year

Section 4. This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, paragraph, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. The findings and recitals herein are declared to be *prima facie* evidence of the law of the Village and shall be received in evidence as provided by the Illinois Compiled Statutes and the courts of the State of Illinois.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
